LAWRENCE R. KLEIN AWARD

The annual award, created in 1981 and named for Nobel Laureate Lawrence Klein, recognizes the most-accurate forecaster among the 50-plus participants in the Blue Chip Economic Indicators newsletter. Candidates are gauged by the accuracy of their forecasts for four key economic indicators over a four-year time period: U.S. economic growth, as measured by real Gross Domestic Product; inflation, as measured by the Consumer Price Index; the civilian unemployment rate, and the three-month Treasury bill rate.
